Summary:

Reporting to the Supervisor of Child and Youth Programs, the Child and Youth Program staff is responsible for the development and delivery of carious child and youth programs. Programs can include: Child minding services, Specialty programs (various sport or creative programs), Birthday Party Host and Drop-In programs.

Position Details:

Varying shifts, including mornings, evenings and weekends.

Qualifications and Experience:

- Experience in the development and delivery of recreational programs specific to children and youth.
- Experience working with children in a recreational setting is an asset.
- Outstanding people skills are essential.
- Post-secondary education in Recreation and Leisure, Physical Education or in a sports-related field is considered an asset, as is previous YMCA experience.
- Holder of a current CPR C and Standard First Aid certification.
- Provide a current Criminal Record Check including Vulnerable Sector screening as per Association policy.
- The successful candidate must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 at commencement of the agreement.



Responsibilities:

- Create a friendly, welcoming environment for families and participants.
- Build relationships and maintain communication with children, parents and co-workers.
- Encourage interaction between participants.
- Design and implement high quality, fun, engaging, age-appropriate programs for children and youth, with a focus on creativity, flexibility and spontaneity.
- Supervise children during scheduled times, be able to recognize unsafe situations or practices and rectify them immediately, always be aware of the whereabouts of supervised children.
- Responsible for the health and safety of participants, co-workers, volunteers and self.
- Adhere to all YMCA Child and Youth policies and procedures.
- Prepare appropriate documentation related to attendance, program plans, incident reports and other administrative requirements meeting supervisor timelines.
- Role model YMCA Standards, YMCA Values and Commitment to Service.
