Description

YMCA Camp Henry is a seasonal summer camp and outdoor center located in Point Pelee National Park near Leamington, Ontario. Since 2017, Camp Henry has offered a variety of programs for children and youth ages 5-16 during the summer, including four and five night overnight camps, day camps, and family camp programs. Point Pelee National Park has many beautiful attractions that inspire children and youth. Our camp offers water- based activities like swimming, kayaking and canoeing and our landbased activities include archery, biking, crafts, games, and exploring nature. All of our activities are designed to support the development of spirit, mind and body for all of our campers. YMCA Camp Henry also operates during the spring and fall seasons as an Outdoor Center, offering a variety of programs for schools, youth, families and private groups. Annually, Camp Henry hosts approximately 300 participants throughout the summer camp programs.

Lifeguards are responsible for the safety and supervision of campers and staff during swimming, canoeing and kayaking programs at our camp. They will work closely with our Waterfront Coordinator to supervise our waterfront programs. They will report directly to the Waterfront Coordinator or Program Coordinator.

Note: This position can also be combined with a Program Facilitator role for a full time contract throughout the summer. Our Program Facilitators are responsible for instructing and facilitating a wide range of programming for varied skill leveled campers (I.e. Biking, Archery, Arts & Crafts, nature programs, all camp games) and delivering high quality activities and overall camper safety. See separate positing for details.

- Implements, and adheres to internal policies and procedures regarding lifeguarding, waterfront, and boating activities and ensures all required safety equipment is in working order
- Ensures all required paperwork and logs are completed

- Responsible for establishing an enjoyable and safe working environment

Other Job Details:

The Lifeguard position is a part time position, however it can be paired with a Program Facilitator role to become full time. As a part time position, this is an hourly paid position, and the candidate lives off site. Candidates can expect to be working 2-3 days a week on site. Working schedules would be arranged ahead of time.

As a full time position paired with the Program Facilitator role, the candidate is required to live on site at YMCA Camp Henry in rustic accommodations from late June until the end of August while camp is in operation. They would be expected to work Sunday afternoon until Friday evening each week.
