Qualifications & Experience:

- Completion of a minimum of one-year post-secondary education in a field of study related to the development of children and youth with special needs; must be returning to post-secondary school in September.
- Up to 1 year experience providing coaching and/or instruction to preschool and youth age children with special needs.
- Interpersonal skills and customer service orientation.
- Outgoing, inclusive and welcoming in nature.

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- Resourceful, flexible, motivated and energetic.
- Healthy Child Development certification (will provide)
- Current Standard First Aid and CPR-C (required before starting work)
- Current satisfactory Police Record Check vulnerable sector
- Must be at least 16 years of age

Compensation/Benefits:

- A YMCA personal membership at our health and fitness branches
- A discount on our Childcare and Camp programs
- Vacation entitlement in accordance with the employment standards regulations

Schedule:

- Monday Friday (Summer Day Camp Training may take place on weekdays, weeknights and on weekends)
- 0-44 hours per week

Responsibilities:

- Provide direct support and guidance to team members in meeting the needs of the camper demonstrating behavioural and emotional needs.
- Develop and implement individual program that recognize the uniqueness and interest of the individual child; monitor and adapt progress to assist each child to successful achieve their goals at camp.
- Complete pre-camp phone calls and submit pre-camp tracking sheets on a weekly basis.
- Ensure ongoing communication with families to provide updates and to problem solve any challenges
- Assist Supervisor and other Counsellors as a resource on different strategies and approaches that will allow campers with special needs to be integrated successfully.
- Deliver integrated recreational support and basic care services to children who may have a developmental and/or physically disability or mental health condition.
- Be responsible for the safety and security of all participants, at all times following the YMCA Child Guidance/Abuse and Serious Occurrence policies.
- Adhere to accepted safety practices and procedures in the use of all equipment and in all activities; keep program areas clean, check for health and safety hazards; assist in the safety and security of campers when on duty, complete and file incident reports when necessary.
- Administers medications as authorized by parent; administer first aid, as required.
- Ensures proper use of equipment and personal devices, such as braces, wheel chairs, etc.

All YMCA Day Camp employees are required to participate in a 4 full days of training process that serves as the foundation for ensuring that our employees can successfully carry out their jobs, and that the staff team is prepared for the summer. This training is required for all new and returning YMCA Day Camp employees. Time off during staff training will only be approved to write exams. This must be arranged ahead of time, as the staff member will be required to complete make-up training prior to the start of camp.
