Award Category	Sponsor	Description
<p>1. <b>Agriculture and Environment Award</b></p>	<p><i>Sylvite Agri-Services and The Andersons Canada</i></p>  	<p>This award recognizes youth who have an interest in the field of agriculture or the environment. The successful candidate will be able to demonstrate his or her participation in either of these areas at the school or community level.</p>
<p>2. <b>Apprenticeship Award</b></p>	<p><i>Kent-Erie Glass &amp; Lock</i></p> 	<p>This award has been established to recognize candidates who, having created for themselves a specific vision of their future, have established the necessary priorities, and have worked diligently toward their goal. The recipient will be recognized for a demonstrated proficiency in any apprenticeship area of skilled trades education, along with a dedicated commitment to pursuing trades participation beyond secondary school. The selection committee will look for related successes in both school and co-op placements.</p>
